

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Perform various duties involving tool use, equipment and machinery
- Handle, distribute, lift and carry construction materials
- Install and remove scaffolding, ramps and barricades at construction sites
- Help demolish buildings and sort, clean and pile salvaged materials
- Excavate, backfill and level earth to grade specifications
- Place, consolidate and protect concrete or masonry structures
- Support plant maintenance, safety monitoring, site services

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

Entrance Requirements

At least Alberta Grade 9 education or equivalent.

To potentially reduce length of apprenticeship term:

Completed courses of study, work experience related to the construction craft labourer trade or a related certificate.

Apprenticeship Program:

A minimum of 12 months, includes technical training, on-the-job training and exam. Journeyperson certificate awarded after successful completion. As an apprentice, you also earn while you learn.
