Plumbers install, remodel and maintain systems that carry water, steam, air and other liquids or gases necessary for sanitation, industrial production, heating, air conditioning and many other systems. On a typical construction job, they do the "roughing in" after the frame and roof of a new building are in place.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Read blueprints & specifications to determine plumbing layout
- Locate, mark, join and secure pipe sections
- Cut holes in walls & floors to accommodate pipe
- Measure, cut, thread and bend pipes to required shape & size
- Install, test, repair and maintain plumbing fixtures & systems
- Assemble and install valves & fittings
- Install underground storm, sanitary & water piping systems

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

Entrance Requirements

To potentially reduce length of apprenticeship term: Completed courses of study, insulator-related work experience or a related journeyperson certificate AND employer's recommendation.

To apply for a Prior Learning Assessment: Previous training/work experience in the trade AND desire to determine level of skill & knowledge or advanced standing in an apprenticeship program.

Apprenticeship program: 4 years, includes technical training, 1,500 hours on-the-job training, and exam. Journeyperson certificate awarded after successful completion. As an apprentice, you also earn while you learn.

Key Skills & Attributes

(technical training and on the job)

- Strong communication, reading, numeracy & problem-solving skills
- Ability to read and interpret blueprints
- Mechanical ability
- Physical stamina & ability to lift heavy pipes (25 kg)
- Ability to work on your feet for long periods & in cramped spaces
